Literacy

In Guided Reading we will be looking at the text Zog. Year 2s will have the challenge of tackling the book 'The Egg' by M.P Robertson and will begin comparing books with similar themes.



In English we will focus on character description, using adjectives to describe and (Year 2) using conjunctions to extend sentences.

In Year 2 we will be developing an awareness of the reader, thinking about long sentences and short sentences. We will investigate different conjunctions and when they can be used. We will be challenged to join our handwriting. In Year 1 we will focus on making sure that all letters are correctly formed and that all sentences have a capital letter and full stop. In Reception we will be developing our phonics skills using the sounds taught so far and concentrating on correct letter formation.

Key vocab – sentence, word, space, punctuation, capital letter, full stops, adjective, noun, verh

Maths


Reception – numbers to 10, shape names and comparing numbers.

Year 1 – place value to 50. We will be looking at representing numbers in different ways.

Year 2 - Multiplication and division – learning the x and ÷ signs, learning 2x, 5x and 10x tables, showing multiplication and divisions pictorially and solving problems involving multiplication and division. Statistics – tally charts and black graphs. Collecting, sorting and sharing information. Explaining the information shown in block charts and tally charts.

Key vocab - respect, compassion, mercy, merciful, belief, compare, learn, Allah, Muslim, Islam.



Geography/History

In History we will be learning about the lives of significant individuals – we will look in detail at the lives of Florence Nightingale and Mary Seacole and how they made a difference.

Science



We will continue to observe seasonal change as we move through winter and into spring, including collecting data on daily weather patterns.

Then we will move onto 'Animals including humans' which will take the whole of Spring Term.

- find out about and describe the basic needs of animals, including humans, for survival (water, food and air)
